The vision of Academic Community Engagement is for faculty and community partners to feel part of a collaborative community of practice utilizing service learning pedagogy, community-based action research, and other forms of community-engaged scholarship to facilitate deep student learning as they explore and address critical societal issues.

The Mission of ACE

What is our purpose? What do we do?

To cultivate community engagement within and across SDSU's research and teaching programs while supporting accessible engagement opportunities for 75% of SDSU's students.

2024-2026 Strategic Priorities and Goals

What goals will help us move forward and evaluate our progress?

- 1. Support the Carnegie Community Engaged campus certification, including building a sustainable infrastructure for ACE at SDSU.
 - **1.1.** Maintain SDSU's **relationship with CSU Center for Community Engagement** and **secure CA Call to Service funding** to support the ACE Office.
 - 24/25: Complete submit the 2023-2024 CA Call to Service Annual Report and submit via the S4 system. [COMPLETED]
 - 24/25: Complete and submit the 2024-2025 CA Call to Service Statement of Intent and submit via the S4 system.
 - 24/25: Meet monthly with CSU Center for Community Engagement Director.
 - 24/25: Meet monthly with CSU Service Learning Directors working group to explore programming, policy, initiatives, and more.
 - 24/25: Attend the 2-day CSU Service Learning Directors Affinity Conference annually in the fall.
 - **1.2.** Successfully complete the **Carnegie re-classification** by the end of AY 2024-2025.
 - 24/25: Establish a Carnegie taskforce | Presidential charge letter. [COMPLETED]
 - 24/25: Design and Implement project plan and materials. [COMPLETED]
 - 24/25: Hold 3-5 working sessions for taskforce members in the fall.

- 24/25: Develop and advertise the inaugural SDSU Excel Awards. [COMPLETED]
- 24/25: Review nominations and select an EXcel Award winner and runners-up. Identify 5-8 campus partnerships to highlight and collaborate (e.g. meetings, site visits, etc.) to strengthen application content.
- 24/25: Collate section drafts into a single application, copyedit, and gather feedback from the key campus stakeholders and consultants.
- 24/25: Organize and complete meetings/site visits for the 5-8 Carnegie-identified community partners.
- 24/25: Host the SDSU Excel Award winner celebratory lecture and luncheon.
- 24/25: Submit Carnegie Reclassification application by April 1, 2025.
- **1.3.** Design and implement a **CANVAS Community-Engaged Learning Homeroom** for asynchronous training, sharing of ACE Community of Practice recordings, managing community engaged faculty listserv, and community discussion board.
 - 24/25: Design and launch the CANVAS Homeroom to interact with community engaged faculty and manage official ACE communication.
 - 24/25: Develop a minimum of four modules that contain short deck-based instructional videos, guides, infographics and other materials related to community engaged course-related tasks: course/project development, designing a CE syllabus, completing the CELT course certification process, and applying for SDSU course designation via Curriculog.
 - 24/25: Set up and launch a CE-related community discussion in CANVAS.
 - 24/25: Redesign of the ACE website so that faculty facing information is complementary to CANVAS Homeroom rather than redundant.
- **1.4.** Employ the assistance of Department Chairs, Program Directors and faculty to ensure known **SL/CE** courses are documented in the SDSU SL/CE Catalog and certified using the CELT (Community Engaged Learning Tool).
 - 24/25: Meet 1:1 with department Chairs/Directors to identify courses and reestablish relationships. [COMPLETED: 35 meetings summer 2024]
 - 24/25: September outreach to Chairs/Directors/Faculty to inform re: ACE Community of Practice events and Carnegie Reclassification goals related to CE course/project data collection.
 - 24/25: Three targeted outreach communications (fall, spring, EOY) to known CE course instructors for both F24 and S25 offering help with the CELT process.
 - 24/25: Beginning the year with 25/30 required CELT-certified courses (30 is the 3-year goal for SDSU set by the CSU Center for Community Engagement), ACE will exceed the goal by the end of 24/25.
- **1.5.** Develop a strategy to **improve data collection/sharing** related to community engagement, including the improvement of risk management processes, ability of faculty/programs to achieve compliance, assessment and reporting.
 - 24/25: Attend monthly CSU S4 Consortia meetings for service learning programs regarding the new V3 of S4 to help determine feasibility for SDSU.

- 24/25: Regular meetings with P2P, risk management working group, and other campus stakeholders, to update campus policies regarding Executive Order (EO) 1064, and subsequently updated EOs.
- 24/25: Develop and implement guidance to departments and 1-2 training sessions for faculty regarding updated risk management processes, including key terminology changes.
- 24/25: Using a campus-wide collaborative approach, develop a plan/proposal to help the SDSU campus better collect, maintain and utilize data related to community engaged courses/projects.
- 25/26: Develop a proposal for the implementation of S4 (or alternative system/process) at SDSU, as appropriate.
- 2. Build campuswide relationships to advance student participation.
 - **2.1. Collaborate with Glazer Center for Leadership** to cross-promote events and initiatives, including conducting students from opportunities into coursework.
 - 24/25: Facilitate a Glazer Center presentation to the ACE Community of Practice about programming and collaboration in recording student service hours.
 - 24/25: Facilitate a way for Glazer Center to promote course opportunities to students on campus.
 - 24/25: Develop a plan to ensure the campus has an effective way to track student service, whether as part of a course or independently.
 - **2.2.** Develop meaningful partnerships to **engage more students in SL/CE courses**.
 - 24/25: Meet with student-facing campus partners (YMOC leadership, EOP leadership, Director of General Studies, Director of Interdisciplinary Studies, and others) to identify ways to connect more students to CE.
 - 24/25: Develop a plan to increase community-engaged course/project outreach with targeted student populations.
 - 24/25: Provide 3-5 faculty mini-grants (\$500-\$1500) for faculty developing new or expanding existing community engaged opportunities for students.
 - **2.3. Explore new campus partnerships** that can increase awareness about community engaged learning opportunities for students while also increasing visibility for faculty.
 - 25/26: Schedule meetings with International Affairs to discuss partnering with the Faculty Global Engagement Awards.
 - 25/26: Schedule meetings with Research and Innovation to discuss S3 and ways to better incorporate and highlight community engaged research.
- 3. Advance the visibility, rigor, credibility, and transparency of community-engaged teacher-scholarship.
 - 3.1. Continue to build a culture of support and collaboration by maintaining the ACE Community of Practice.

- 24/25: Schedule and hold six (6) hybrid lunch & learn events reaching 200+ faculty, record and make them available asynchronously on CANVAS site.
- **3.2.** Using strategic partnerships developed during the Carnegie Reclassification efforts, **rebuild the ACE Advisory Committee**, and institutionalize it as a Senate Committee.
 - 24/25: Appoint two faculty in residence. [COMPLETED]
 - 24/25: Engage the Carnegie Taskforce members feedback in determining the most appropriate/effective composition of a campus-wide advisory committee.
 - 25/26: Submit an Action Item to SDSU Senate to charter the advisory committee.
 - 25/26: Charge the committee to explore ways to enhance the importance of community engaged work within the RTP process.
- **3.3. Promote and raise awareness of exemplary community engaged learning** at SDSU through ACE website, listserv, community emails and partnerships with StratComm.
 - 24/25: Establish a dynamic media repository on the ACE website (e.g., EXcel Award winners/runners up and/or other exemplary faculty community engaged work).
 - 24/25: Engage CCR on SDSU EXcel Award process and amplify media assets through campuswide communicator partnership to highlight the work of the 5-8 Carnegie highlighted partnerships (at minimum).
- **3.4. Update the Reappointment, Tenure and Promotion (RTP) Policy** so that a faculty member's community engaged work positively impacts RTP outcomes in a more formalized way.
 - 25/26: Work with Senate leadership to issue a referral to Faculty Affairs (FA)
 (Academic Policy & Planning and ACE Advisory Committee as collaborating
 committees) to explore updates to the RTP Policy.
 - 25/26: Research how other campuses have adjusted RTP policy to formally recognize and reward community engaged work.
 - 25/26: Collaborate with Senate committees to move recommended RTP Policy updates through the Senate.
